For Caltrans Contract in District 2 – Shasta County, California

Summit Environmental Contractors (SEC) will provide a Lead Compliance Plan (LCP), excavation transportation and removal of nearly 2,000 tons of hazardous soil containing aerielly deposited lead (ADL). This contract is awarded by Tullis Inc. for California Department of Transportation (Caltrans) for the Highway 273 Shoulder Widening in Redding, California.

The removal of the soil containing aerielly deposited lead is in preparation for shoulder widening taking place on Route 273. The widening of this highway will increase efficiency as well as safety for vehicles. The contaminated materials must be removed prior to the start of widening. By removing this contaminated material Summit is creating a safer working environment for all personnel on site, as well as those living in the nearby community.

Summit's Lead Compliance Plan documents the regulatory-driven procedure to handle lead contaminated material. The plan addresses the handling, removing and transporting of this material to meet the Caltrans Standard Specifications.
